

Prayer Request Line – 230 prayed to give thanks and prayed for those needing prayer. Perpetual Adoration – more than 200 participated in uninterrupted adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Mass Volunteers – 657 choir and musicians, Eucharist ministers, lectors, ushers, Sacristans, Liturgy of the Word leaders, greeters and emergency medical responders participated to make Mass the celebration that renews our spirit and hope.



#### **OUTREACH**

A total of 330 parish members volunteered to reach out to members of our community and beyond, through the following ministries: Hospital and Nursing Home visits, Womb-to-Tomb, Grief Ministry, Ministry to Homebound, Ministry to Persons with Disabilities, Funeral Lunch volunteers, Senior Lunch volunteers, Sharing and Caring Hands, Prison Ministry, Marriage Couples Ministry, Singles Ministry, Community Outreach ministries, Curbside Ministry, Medical Ministry, BIZAA International Outreach Multicultural Ministry, Feed My Starving Children, CEAP and CROSS food shelves, JustFaith, Giving Tree, and Franciscan Brothers of Peace.

439 students and their parents participated at least monthly in helping causes, such as nursing home visits and charitable giving. Students collected nonperishable food for C.R.O.S.S., made cards for those in the military and their family members, donated socks to the Toasty Toes program, made sandwiches and collecting winter clothing for Sharing & Caring Hands, participated in a monthly Day of Prayer honoring specific people who have contributed generously to the school, offered money and baby items for the Baby Bottle Campaign/Baby Shower benefiting those facing unplanned pregnancies, and participated in many other events to support people in the local community.




#### **FAITH FORMATION**



#### YOUTH

The Summer Stretch and Christpower programs engaged over 100 Youth, Junior and Senior High, in summer projects to assist the elderly, disabled, and others in need. Our Youth groups also donated over 75 stockings full of toys and personal items for children – to CEAP.

Finance and Administration – How is your self-management? Do your priorities express lasting love for God, family and community?















## July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012 Annual Financial Report



St. Vincent's remains financially stable. All in all, however, the parish experienced a relatively flat year, financially and demographically.

- Weekly offertory giving increased 1.3% and once again met its operating budget
- Unemployment and underemployment, however, still affect our parish, and marginal gains in giving puts more pressure on cost containment and savings.
- Catholic mass attendance remains a concern. St. Vincent's has begun to measure attendance and will use this data to gauge improvement. Parish households declined slightly from 3,615 to 3,603.
- The School managed its fiscal budget very well. However, enrollment declined from 456 to 439.
- The After School program had another very good year.
- Faith Formation enrollment continued to reflect the decline in numbers of school age children in local School Districts.
- The parish's most immediate fiscal concern Is the aging of its facility. The Church building will be 25 years old in 2013. Boilers were replaced in the summer of 2012, and the lighting system failed in fall 2012. Additionally, the sound system began to fail and is being replaced. Total expenditures in fiscal 2013 will exceed \$250,000. A monthly facilities envelope and the Harvest Festival are the two major sources for funding for our facility.
- Important changes to expand and improve St. Vincent de Paul Cemetery are planned for fiscal year 2013 and beyond.

(Calendar year giving for 2011 compares unfavorably with 2010. However, overall giving was higher in Fiscal 2012 due to the higher contributions in the first 6 months of calendar 2012.)

643 Households utilize automatic withdrawal of contributions by ACH or Credit Card, for a total of \$607,529, or 33.08% of all offertory giving.
