

### **News from FMSC**

The gentleman in the story is Mark Crea who leads us at FMSC. The woman is Sherry, who along with her husband, leads the "Love a Child" organization in Haiti (www.loveachild.com). Both are amazing people. I spent a week at Love A Child two months after the earthquake. Note below is from Mark Crea.



When I was in Haiti last November, my team came across a little boy named Nelson sitting in the mud alone. Our host, Sherry Burnett who is a missionary with Love a Child, scooped the little one up and held him for our entire time in the village. The little boy, whose name in Creole meant "I don't want you", was for a time safe in the arms of someone who cared and wanted him. Sherry could not get Nelson off her mind, and six weeks after our November visit, returned to rescue Nelson.

Nearly three months later, after receiving FMSC food and lots of love, Nelson is doing well. God provided for Nelson, resurrecting him from a life of despair to a life of hope. As we approach this Easter weekend when we celebrate our Savior's resurrection, I thought it would be nice to share the video with you. A resurrection story that pales in comparison to the Easter story, but a wonderful story of hope. It is a bit long, but clearly it is not a professionally-produced, slick, dressed-up story. It is simply the story of a little boy whose life has been saved by the gifts of people like you.
