

The Queen of May

The month dedicated to the of the Blessed Virgin Mary as the "Queen of May". It is not known exactly how this tradition came about but it dates back to the 13th century as a popular devotion in Italy and later came to be spread throughout the whole world. In his 1965 encyclical, Mense Maio (The Month of May), Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as a time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions.

There are many ways that Catholics offer Mary special honor in May: pilgrimages, visits to churches dedicated to her, and a more attentive recitation of the rosary. There are also the celebrations in May of Our Lady of Fatima (May 13) and the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (May 31).

One of the more popular Marian celebrations in May is the May crowning. This is a celebration usually involving children who bring forth flowers to place before a statue of Mary, which is itself crowned with a gold or floral crown. The crowning signifies the importance of Mary as the Queen of Heaven and the Mother of God.

Another ancient tradition is the planting of a Mary Garden. This is an old devotion that originated at monasteries and convents in medieval Europe. In the Middle Ages there were many floral images that were designated as symbols of Mary. There were literally hundreds of flowers, herbs and other plants that were used as symbols of Mary's life, mysteries and virtues.

The first reference to an actual garden dedicated to Mary is from the life The month dedicated to the honor of St. Fiacre, the Irish patron saint of gardening, who planted and tended a garden around the oratory to Our Lady he built at his famous hospice for the poor and infirm in France in the 7th

> Some people give honor to Our Lady by dedicating the month of May as a time to consecrate themselves to the Blessed Virgin Mary. This act of personal consecration is meant to be an embracing of the life of holiness and an entrustment to Mary as one's mother in every aspect of life. Among the best-known acts of consecration is one developed by St. Louis de Montfort in his classic work, Total Consecration to Mary.

Whatever one's personal Marian devotion may be, all Catholics should have some kind of observance of May as the month of Mary. If you don't have one that you regularly practice, perhaps one of these devotions could become your own as we give honor this month to Mary-our Lady, our Mother, our Queen of Heaven.




# Grand Knight's Message Sean Olmstead, Grand Knight

# **Seminarians**

James Stiles

My name is James Stiles. I was born in Lexington, KY, but have been living in Minnesota with my family since I was six years old. I am currently 26 years old. I grew up in what's considered a large family by today's standards. There are six kids in my family, two boys and four girls; I am the fourth child. I was educated at a Catholic K-8 school, St. Mary's, in Owatonna, MN. After this I went to the public high school in Owatonna for four years and received my high school diploma.
