Pastoral Council Minutes—St. Vincent de Paul March 17, 2009

AGENDA ITEMS:

- 1. <u>Prayer:</u> Dave led the Bible reading, and prayers for intentions followed. Rose will do the reading at the April meeting.
- 2. February Minutes: The minutes of the February meeting were approved as written.
- 3. Strategic Planning Town hall Meetings: Norm handed out material showing the changes made by the Interim Committee as a result of the meetings for the Council's consideration. Discussion followed, and several suggestions for further changes were made. Norm recorded the remarks and will take them back to the committee for further work. A revised draft will be furnished to the Council. Changes are also being made to the Mission and Vision Statements, and those drafts will also be presented to the Council for consideration. Norm mentioned that the Transition Team will meet March 31. Rose, Tom, Dave, and Nancy are members, along with Norm and Jerry. The project is expected to be completed by June.
- 4. <u>Pastoral Council Visibility:</u> There was general discussion about how the Council and its functions could be made more visible to parishioners; how to encourage them to contact Council members with questions, etc. The newsletter, parish website, Welcome Desk, space in the kiosk, a display board at Coffee Sundays and at school functions and a new picture of the Council each year on the website were possibilities that were mentioned. Ann will talk to Kathleen about a space in the Kiosk and about having a poster board at Coffee Sundays. Tom will put a report in the bulletin after each meeting.
- **5.** Parishioners to Parishioner communication: Ann raised the issue of bringing people more into parish life, and there was general discussion of strategies which could be tried. However, since this will be an agenda item for the Transition Team, it was set aside.
- **6.** Pastoral Council Retreat Update: Space has been booked at St. Therese for September 26. A retreat master has not been determined as yet. Fr. Jack suggested that good preparation for the retreat would include reading the letters of St. Paul.
- 7. Agenda Items for Next Month: (a) A report from the Transition Team. (b) Marci would like everyone to start a folder for Council matters. Three-ring binders will be available at the next meeting for that purpose. Marci will also have material ready to start the folders, and envisions their being passed on to new members as they come on board. (d) Ann will be checking on the possibility of setting up a parish email which could be used for reminders, announcements, etc. to people who sign up for it, and will report next month. She will also report on how many hits the Council website gets and on getting the kiosk updated. Tom suggested that it would be helpful for Dave to attend the agenda-setting meeting, and Dave and Marci agreed. Also, since Dave will be out of town for the next meeting, he will try to participate through a conference call.
- **8.** Pastor's report: (a) Fr. Jack reported that the parish will not be buying the land north of the church at this time. Bishop Nienstadt feels it would not be advisable to increase our debt in this economy. (b) We can expect minor changes in some prayers and music at masses.
