Mongolia—The Youngest Church in the World

Mongolia is located in Asia between Russia to the north and China to the south. It is a harsh environment with long cold winters and very little rainfall. The Mongols are a nomadic people who can trace their history back several thousand years. The Mongolian Empire of the 13th century was founded by Temujin; also known as Genghis Khan.

In recent history, it had been greatly influenced by Communist



Russia. Since the fall of the Soviet Union, it has become a democratic country and able to govern itself.

In 1991, Catholic missionaries began to plant the church in this region. Today there are six Catholic Churches in all of Mongolia. They focus their ministry on recovery and hope for families struggling with addictions, poverty and limited options for education and employment.

God's Word for Mission

Promoting Knowledge of Faith

"I will bless the Lord at all times; praise shall always be in my mouth. My soul will glory in the Lord that the poor may hear and be glad. ... The Lord is close to the brokenhearted, saves those whose spirit is crushed. Many are the troubles of the just, but the Lord delivers from them all (Psalm 34:1-3; 19-20).

A Saint for Mission: St. Vincent de Paul

Vincent de Paul was born in France in 1581 to peasant farmers and was the third of four children. His parents noticed his talents in reading and writing and decided to send him to the seminary. Vincent advanced as a scholar. On a trip across the Mediterranean Sea he was captured by pirates and sold into slavery for two years. Eventually, after several adventures, he returned to France.

He dedicated himself to serving the poor in the countryside and had a great devotion to galley slaves and convicts and

spent time ministering to them humanizing their conditions. He also became a regular teacher and retreat leader for clergy who were poorly trained and in great need of reform.

Vincent's efforts led to the forming of a religious order dedicated to serving the poor known as the Congregation for Mission. He also inspired the Daughters of Charity and the St. Vincent DePaul Society dedicated to serving the poor and suffering. He died in 1660.



Serving the Poor and Vulnerable

As followers of Christ, we are challenged to make serving the poor and vulnerable a priority. This means helping to create conditions that relieve the burdens of poverty and create opportunities for marginalized people to be heard. It means defending those who can't defend themselves. It means paying attention to how lifestyles, policies and institutions impact the poor and working for change where justice is lacking.

From the Bible we learn that the justice of a society is tested and judged by how it treats the poor and those who live on the



margins. Jesus said his mission was to bring good news to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind and freedom to the oppressed (Lk 4:18-19). Similarly, in the Last Judgment, he said the we will be judged by how we respond to the hungry, the thirsty, the prisoner and stranger (Mt. 25:31-46).

Each of us are called to look at the world from the perspective of the poor and vulnerable and do our part to lift them up.
